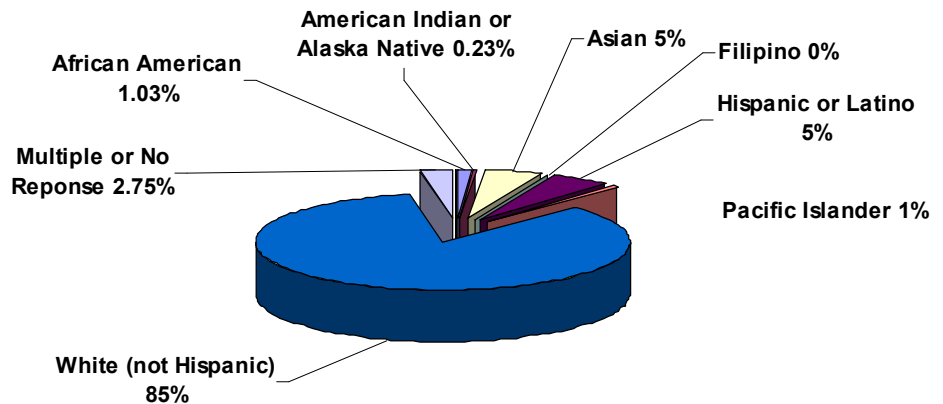

School Facilities
